What is sexuality?



- Sexuality encompasses more than just sexual activity.
- It also includes topics such as love, physical touch, feelings and **hygiene**.
- Sexuality is important for everyone.
- It is considered a personal, private and **intimate** matter.
- It is present in every person's life to varying degrees.
- Everyone's sexuality is different.

What is sexuality?



- It includes pleasure, emotional connection, the satisfaction of sexual needs and intimacy with another person.
- Everyone has the right to live out their sexuality, even if they experience limited autonomy.
- Healthy expressions of sexuality do not harm anyone. This means that we do not harm ourselves or others.

What is sexuality?

A healthy and socially accepted approach to sexuality includes:

- **Respect**

We respect the wishes and needs of the other person and know the word “no”.



- **Consent**

Everyone agrees to the activity and can refuse it at any time.



- **Safety**

We do not harm ourselves or others.



- **Communication**

We discuss what we like and don't like, etc.



It's good to have the opportunity to talk to someone about sexuality.



What is sexuality?



- To have a **healthy** sexual life, it is good to **learn** about sexuality.
- This means knowing basic things about the body, hygiene, sex, contraception, and other topics.
- If we have questions, we should talk to someone we trust.
- For example: a family member, friend, partner,
- or a professional who helps with sexuality and relationships.

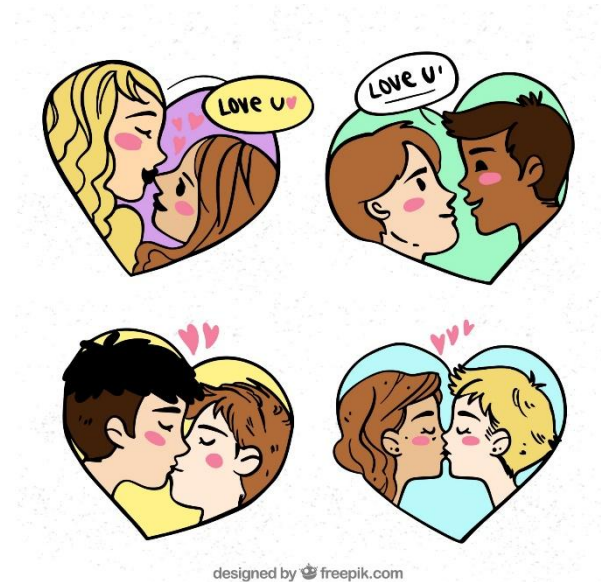

What is sexuality?

- **People show their sexuality in different ways.**
- For example, by hugging, kissing, holding hands, caressing or having sex.
- If a person is not satisfied with their sex life for a long time, they may feel bad.
- For example: anxious, sad or angry.



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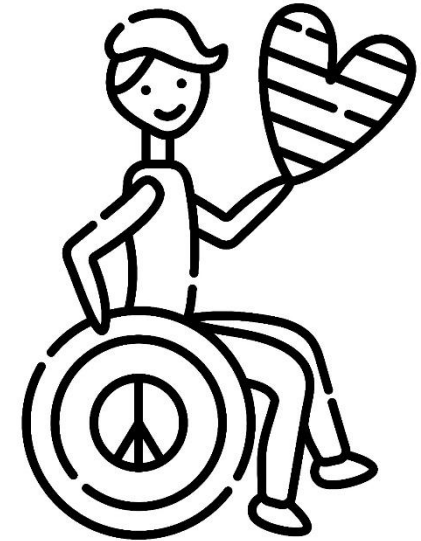


What is sexuality?

- A disability (physical, mental or psychological) does not mean that a person has no sexual needs.
- But a disability can change the way sexuality is experienced.
- For example, you may need special aids, different ways of showing sexuality, or a different **frequency**.

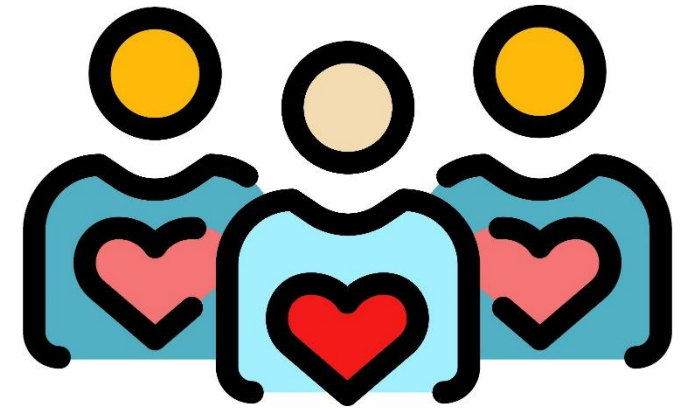


frequency

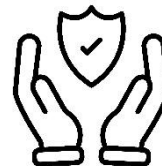
